We are so grateful to John Brooks, Austin Nuckols, Stefan Melnyk, and Natalie Elder for creating this masterpiece for us. Other than giving a whopping seventeen fantastic performances of three amazing new operas, another of our main goals for the 2021-22 Season was to expand our Board of Directors.
